## Who we are

The Sustainability Subcommittee is endorsed by the School's Governing Council and School Leaders. It is made up of passionate staff and parents who want to inspire sustainability ideas and projects within the student community.

The 'Grange Green Beans' are the student representatives from all year levels that voluntarily give up several lunch playtimes per term to plan and complete projects that they decide are most beneficial for the school community and their local environment.

# How we're making a difference

The sustainability committee with the Grange Green Beans are part of <u>Eco Schools</u> and have completed an Eco Schools audit which identified key areas that GPS is excelling and areas of opportunity for improved sustainability.

We're also involved with the <u>Junior Landcare initiative</u> and the <u>Green Adelaide Sustainable Schools Program</u> which provide education resources and opportunities for grant funding.

## What we've done

#### **GPS** Garden

Thanks to an amazing amount of work led by one of our Teaching Staff, Daniel, we've established an incredible fruit and vegetable garden that is open every every lunch time for children to play and explore with their green thumb.

#### Trees

We're actively applying for grants to repopulate our open spaces with native trees to provide an inviting natural environment for our students and our local bird population.

#### Yarning Circle

We want to create a yarning circle space in our outdoor nature area. A yarning circle is an important aspect of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and have been used by indigenous peoples from around the world to build relationships, converse, share, learn and communicate cultural knowledge. We believe this will be a valuable addition to our school grounds.
